AN IDAHO WEEKEND GETAWAY IN CANYON COUNTY

We've got a whole trip planned for you.

The first sip of a good wine. The sweetness of an apple just picked from the tree. The smell of fresh air while driving through wide-open country.

What if you could get a taste of the good life, just for one weekend?



After a long work week of endless deadlines and rush hour traffic, hit the open road toward Caldwell, Idaho. If you're driving from Boise, you'll pass through Meridian and Nampa to see the suburbs slowly fade away into miles of patchwork farmland, with the rugged Owyhees in the distance.





INDIAN CREEK

Driving into Downtown Caldwell, you'll

find a small frontier settlement that's been transformed into a burgeoning community with a thriving food and wine scene. Many chefs, business owners and entrepreneurs from Boise are setting up shop in Caldwell with boutiques, restaurants and more.

Grab a glass of wine or an ice cream cone. Browse the shelves of antique stores for hidden finds. Feel free to roam.

At the center of it all is Indian Creek Plaza. Known as the "front porch of Caldwell," this vibrant outdoor venue is filled with shady trees, bubbling fountains and an amphitheater — all surrounded by some of Caldwell's best-loved restaurants, retail and entertainment.

Join in a game of cornhole, play with your kids in the fountain or catch a live concert. In the winter, you can look at the thousands of colorful holiday lights strung up through town, or ice skate along an outdoor ice track that meanders through the heart of the city.

INDIAN CREEK STEAKHOUSE

After exploring the town a bit by foot,

stop by the Indian Creek Steakhouse for a hearty meal. Saddle up to the bar for a local Idaho brew or handcrafted cocktail and order your choice of steak.









LODGING

Check into a cozy stay at the Best Western

Caldwell Inn and Suites. The hotel is located just off I-84 in east Caldwell, complete with a pool, hot tub, fitness center and complimentary breakfast.

As the sun starts to rise over the Owyhees,

walk over to Flying M for a cup of houseroasted coffee and some fresh-baked pastries. Covered with local art and full of homegrown charm, this eclectic cafe is the perfect spot for a quick breakfast.





LOVELY HOLLOW FARM

Drive 20 minutes north on the AgVentureTrail to Lovely Hollow Flower Farms. Wander through vibrant gardens blooming with dahlias, daisies and daffodils. Take time to smell the flowers, pick them and create your own colorful bouquet. (Be sure to take some pictures so you can capture the moment!)







AGVENTURE TRAIL

The AgVenture trail is a selfguided adventure through working farms, orchards, and produce stands across the Snake River Valley. **Rub shoulders with local** farmers, learn new skills, and experience the simple life along the 40-mile loop through Idaho's booming agricultural community.

LITTLE COW MOUNTAIN

Just 16 minutes southeast is Little Cov

Mountain Farm. Roam the green pastures and learn how the ranchers tend the land and take care of the thousands of animals they raise here. You'll get up close to chickens, cows and horses, and you might make a furry friend (or two) along the way.

After touring the pastures, go for a quick hike right outside the gates of the farm. You can wander through the high desert where thousands of hawks, eagles and other raptors nest. If you're quiet enough, you might spot some deer or elk trotting through the sagebrush.







VINE AND BRANCH RANCH

After working up an appetite, walk over to the Vine and Branch Ranch. Order a fresh plate made with hyper-local ingredients grown right here and at other farms close by, including Peaceful Belly Farms, McIntyre Farms, Teton Wildflower Honey and more.

Pair the Solstice Pasta with some local cider, sit back... and taste the simple life.

While you're at the ranch, walk over to Peaceful Belly Farms. The organic gardens here grow over 180 veggies, fruits, berries and flowers, all raised by hand. Tour the gardens, smell the fresh produce and pick up some snacks along the way.

If you plan ahead, you can sign up to take a class and learn how to can vegetables or make cheese. The folks at Peaceful Belly are down-to-Earth and love to talk about their passion for growing good food.

LAKEVIEW PRODUCE

On the way back to Caldwell, swing by Lakeview Produce. This classic produce stand has been a hidden local secret for years. Pick through bushels and baskets of fresh local produce, all grown in orchards and farms just miles away. Grab a pie or loaf of artisan bread baked just that morning. Chat with the owner for a while — they'll know all the secrets for picking the best apples.









AMANO

Head back to Downtown Caldwell for

some well-deserved margaritas and street tacos at Amano. This up-and-coming local favorite is located in a gorgeously renovated historic brick building right along Main Street. Run by the Alamilla family, this high-end restaurant features the bold, complex flavors of Mexican cuisine and fresh local ingredients harvested right here in the valley.

ORCHARD HOUSE

After sleeping in a while, take a quick 15-minute drive to the Orchard House in Marsing. This homey, cozy joint is tucked alongside the lush vineyards of Idaho wine country, serving up fresh coffee and breakfast to locals and out-of-towners alike. Order a fresh batch of beignets — fluffy, sweet French doughnuts sprinkled with powdered sugar and a pot of freshly-brewed coffee for the table.








STE CHAPELLE

After a long brunch, drive just 4 minutes down the road to Ste Chapelle Winery.

Named after a famous European cathedral, this winery looks like a scene taken out of the French countryside. The wine tasting room features lofty ceilings with gothic, vaulted windows looking out to the green vistas of vineyards outside. Here, you can taste bold, flavorful wines that have earned national and international acclaim.



HUSTON VINEYARDS

After taking in the views one last time

from the outdoor patio, drive a few minutes down the road to Huston Vineyards.



Located just off Chicken Dinner Road, this winery is known for its award-winning Chicken Dinner White and Chicken Dinner Red wines. The name of these wines (and the road they're named after) come from a quirky Idaho legend involving a potholed road, an Idaho governor and an incredible chicken dinner.

The owners, Greg and Mary Algers, would love to tell you the whole story.


HAT RANCH

After tasting wines in the Algers' beautifurustic barn, head over to Hat Ranch Winery, just five minutes away. From their spacious tasting room, you can enjoy panoramic views of the Owyhee mountains and the vineyard below while sipping on a glass of wine. The vineyard here is known for its award-winning Dry Moscato and Sauvignon Blanc.



Finish the afternoon with a farm to fork dinner at Parma Ridge Winery. Nestled on a ridge overlooking the entire Snake River Valley, this winery is also home to an upscale restaurant no foodie should miss.

From appetizers to full-course meals, each dish is infused with fresh ingredients and local flavor. Order a juicy, grass-fed ribeye steak with a side of mashed Idaho potatoes, or a lightly smoked salmon pan-fried in lemon butter.
